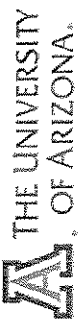

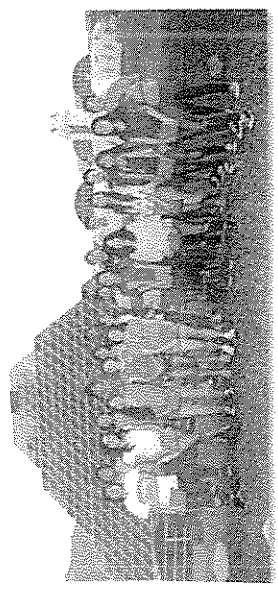

▲ ▲ ▲ An initiative of Early Academic Outreach at The University of Arizona, the Native American Science & Engineering Program (NASEP) is a FREE, year-long program designed to provide Native American high school students with the necessary resources to enroll in college and pursue a career in a Science Technology Engineering and Mathematics (STEM). Through interactions with university experts, hands-on projects, and college preparation workshops, participants are exposed to a wide variety of STEM areas, including environmental sustainability, engineering, computer programming, and optical sciences.

- Participate in one-on-one college preparation coaching with University of Arizona affiliates
- Receive an educational technology device to use for academic and college preparation
- Connect with faculty and representatives from STEM-related fields
